WEEKLY UPDATE 1

STRIP-OUT, MAKE SAFE & SITE PREP

From your demolition, rubble, exposed columns, propping & safety netting pics.

Core Tasks

- Full H&S setup: barricades, signage, PPE compliance, controlled access.
- Soft strip: remove ceilings, services, fittings, loose FF&E.
- Demolish non-structural walls/panels;
 carefully expose feature stone & brickwork.
- Remove old bar finishes, counters, back-bar joinery (retain useful salvage).
- Lift/stack reusable deck boards where required for below-deck works.
- Strip roof coverings, insulation & rainwater goods (seen in exposed truss photos).
- Protect retained tree trunk feature & any heritage elements.

WEEKLY UPDATE 2

TRUCTURAL STABILISATION & PRIMARY FRAMING

Seen: scaffold against high walls, new steel on trestles, roof truss grid, foundation cages, stone column rebuild.

Core Tasks

- Engineer inspection & sign-off of retained walls.
- Repair/strengthen damaged masonry; rebuild stone feature columns at entrance.
- Install new concrete footings & rebar cages where columns move/extend.
- Set & weld new structural steel (posts, beams, truss chord replacements).
- Integrate/brace around live tree trunk feature piercing bar & roof plane.
- Core drill & set chemical anchors where new steel fixes to existing slab/walls.
